Bae saves the day for world team

INCHEON, Korea, Republic Of Bae Sang-moon never felt the kind of pressure that weighed on him Friday at the Presidents Cup.

He only made news in South Korea this year during a failed bid to extend his waiver for mandatory military service. He wasn't sure what kind of reception he would receive at the Jack Nicklaus Golf Club Korea. And as Bae stood over a 12-foot putt that was critical to the International team's rally, half his teammates were on the edge of the green and thousands of Koreans were watching in the gallery.

"I'm pretty sure he was nervous. I was nervous watching him," Danny Lee said. "So he had to stand up and man up, and hit that golf ball."

The celebration when the putt dropped was raw emotion, a defining moment for Bae and the International team in its bid to give the Americans a fight.

Bae teamed with Lee for a 1-up fourballs victory over Rickie Fowler and Jimmy Walker, and the Internationals won their first team session in four years to pull within a point of the Americans. Next up is a double session Saturday of eight matches that will shape the final round.

"That putt Sang-moon made on No. 18 today was probably the highlight of the last two days for us," International captain Nick Price said.

Price had other reasons to cheer. Louis Oosthuizen and Branden Grace made three big putts around the turn and sailed to a 4-and-3 win over Jordan Spieth and Dustin Johnson, while Charl Schwartzel and Thongchai had little trouble against an American team of Chris Kirk and Bill Haas that went 13 holes of nothing better than par.

The Americans, up 4-1 after the opening session, had their lead cut to 5 1/2-4 1/2.

BYLAW #4323 - CITY LOAN AGREEMENT MEDICINE HAT CURLING CLUB (MHCC)

TAKE NOTICE that the Medicine Hat City Council, in the Province of Alberta has given first reading to Bylaw #4323. This bylaw will upon final passage and approval authorize the City of Medicine Hat to provide a loan to the Medicine Hat Curling Club (MHCC).

WHEREAS:

- the MHCC is a non-profit Recreation Public Company incorporated in Alberta

AND WHEREAS:

- the MHCC leases land ("City Lands") from the City pursuant to a Lease Agreement dated May 19, 1999 ("Lease Agreement").
- the MHCC has built on the City Lands a curling facility ("Curling Club Facility") that is operated for the benefit of MHCC members and for members of the general public.
- the MHCC owns the Curling Club Facility, however, at the expiry of the term, or earlier termination, of the Lease Agreement, the Curling Club Facility and any other buildings, structures and improvements on the City Lands become the City's property.
- the MHCC has planned infrastructure upgrades and renovations to the Curling Club Facility at an estimate cost of Four Hundred Forty Thousand Dollars (\$440,000).
- MHCC requested funding from the City in the amount of One Hundred Forty Thousand Dollars (\$140,000) (the "Loan") to assist the MHCC in paying for a portion of the upgrades and renovations for the Curling Club Facility.
- the terms and conditions of a proposed loan agreement between the City and the MHCC are attached as Schedule "A" to this Bylaw and form part of this Bylaw (the "Loan Agreement").
- in the event the MHCC defaults on the loan, the City wishes to have the option to terminate the Lease Agreement.
- Council considers that the Loan to the MHCC will be used for a purpose that will benefit the City and the City's residents.

NOW THEREFORE THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF MEDICINE HAT IN COUNCIL ASSEMBLED ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. The City is hereby authorized to loan to the MHCC the amount of One Hundred Forty Thousand Dollars (\$140,000) at the rate of interest, for the term, and substantially on the terms and conditions and for the purposes set out in the Loan Agreement.
2. The City is hereby authorized to enter into an agreement with the MHCC substantially in the same form as set out in the Loan agreement for the purposes of providing the Loan to the MHCC.
3. a. The Loan Agreement, any other agreements, and any amendments thereto in relation to the Loan (except in relation to the amount of the Loan) may be approved by the Chief Administrative Officer.
b. The Mayor and City Clerk or their delegates are authorized to execute the Loan Agreement and any other agreements in relation to the Loan as well as other documents necessary to give effect to such agreements. The City Clerk or her delegate is authorized to affix the corporate seal of the City to the foregoing agreements and other documents necessary to give effect to such agreements.
4. The source of the money to fund the Loan to the MHCC will be the City's Infrastructure Reserve.
5. This Bylaw shall come into force at the beginning of the day that it is passed.

NOW THEREFORE NOTICE is hereby given by the Council of the City of Medicine Hat that, unless a poll of the electors is demanded, as provided for by the terms of Section 231 of the *Municipal Government Act*, the said Council may pass the said borrowing bylaw.

AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that, unless a sufficient petition demanding a poll of the electors is received within 15 days following the date of the last publication of this Notice, the Council may pass the said borrowing bylaws as described in the *Municipal Government Act*, Sections 219 to 226.

FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that a copy of the proposed bylaw may be inspected by the public during normal office hours (8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.) at the City Clerk Department, Second Floor, City Hall, 580 First Street, S.E., Medicine Hat, Alberta.

CART COLLECTION

- Yard waste material in plastic bags WILL NOT be collected.
