

# Knicks a lot better with their stars

Carmelo Anthony and Kristaps Porzingis were back for the start and weren't needed for the finish.

With a rough stretch behind them and the NBA champions ahead, the Knicks knew they couldn't let this game get away.

"That was part of I know my game plan and my mindset, and that was big for me to send that message to everybody else," Anthony said, "just not play with this game and get after it from the jump."

Anthony had 19 points, 10 rebounds and eight assists in his return from a two-game absence, and New York snapped a four-game losing streak with a 102-84 victory over the Phoenix Suns on Friday night.

Porzingis also rejoined the lineup with seven points and seven rebounds, and the Knicks sent the Suns to their 13th straight road loss.

Anthony had sat out with soreness in his surgically repaired left knee, and Porzingis missed his first game of the season Thursday with an upper respiratory illness. Having them back helped Aron Afflalo, who scored 12 of his 17 points in helping the Knicks open a big first-quarter lead that was never really threatened.

That gave the starters plenty of rest before they host Golden State on Sunday.

"They're a championship team, they really are," Porzingis said. "They're playing at an amazing level

right now so it definitely won't be an easy game for us, but it's an opportunity."

Rookie Devin Booker scored 21 points for the Suns, who committed 16 turnovers and fell to 4-21 on the road. Their last road victory was Dec. 7 in Chicago.

**CELTICS 113, MAGIC 94**  
BOSTON — Kelly Olynyk and Marcus Smart scored 16 points apiece as the Boston Celtics won a season-high fifth straight game, beating the slumping Orlando Magic.

Jae Crowder and Evan Turner each added 15 points, and Isaiah Thomas had 14 points and eight assists in just 27 minutes. Led by Olynyk, who scored nine points in the fourth quarter, the Celtics seized control by starting the period on a 22-4 run and pushing their lead as high as 27.

Nik Vucevic led Orlando with 14 points and eight rebounds.

**CAVALIERS 114, PISTONS 106**

AUBURN HILLS, Mich. — Kevin Love scored 19 of his 29 points in the first half, Kyrie Irving had 28 points and the Cleveland Cavaliers rolled to another high-scoring win, 114-106 over the Detroit Pistons.

The Cavaliers have won three straight since losing to Chicago in Tyronn Lue's first game as Cleveland's coach.

Cleveland has scored at least 114 points in each of the past three games. LeBron James had 20 points, nine rebounds and eight assists, shrugging off a rare missed dunk in the third quarter.

Andre Drummond had 20 points

and eight rebounds for Detroit.

**HEAT 107, BUCKS 103**

MILWAUKEE — Dwyane Wade scored 24 points and hit a long jumper with 44.5 seconds left, and the Miami Heat won their third straight road game by beating the Milwaukee Bucks.

Wade led a balanced scoring effort with all five Miami starters scoring in double figures. Chris Bosh added 20.

Giannis Antetokounmpo led the Bucks with 28 points.

**MAVERICKS 91, NETS 79**

DALLAS — Chandler Parsons had 19 points and a season-high 10 rebounds while Deron Williams struggled in his first game against his former team and the Dallas Mavericks beat the Brooklyn Nets.

Parsons led the Mavericks in scoring for the fifth time in six games.

Brook Lopez scored 28 points to lead the Nets, who had a four-game winning streak in Dallas snapped. Brooklyn is 3-12 in January with one game remaining in the month, which included the firing of coach Lionel Hollins.

**THUNDER 116, ROCKETS 108**

OKLAHOMA CITY — Russell Westbrook's sixth triple-double of the season helped the Thunder defeat the Houston Rockets.

Westbrook finished with 26 points, 14 assists and 10 rebounds. It was the 25th triple-double of his career.

Kevin Durant had 33 points and 12 rebounds for the Thunder, who have won 10 of 11 overall and six straight at home.

James Harden had 33 points, seven rebounds and seven assists for the Rockets.

# Fight with staff member has L.A.'s Griffin in trouble

The Los Angeles Clippers have completed their investigation into Blake Griffin's punch-out of a team staff member and are awaiting the results of the NBA's inquiry, which could come early next week.

Griffin wasn't at Friday night's game against the Lakers and neither was assistant equipment manager Matias Testi, whom the star forward punched at a Toronto restaurant on Jan. 23. Griffin broke his right shooting hand and will be out another four-to-six weeks after not playing since Dec. 26 because of a different injury.

Testi wasn't at Staples Center either. A team spokesman said the NBA is likely to announce its findings early next week.

"I'm satisfied I know what happened," coach Doc Rivers said before the Clippers hosted the Lakers.

Rivers didn't shed any light on what led to the altercation between Griffin and Testi, who are friends. Rivers said the two men have since been in touch, but he didn't know what was said.

Earlier in the week, Rivers had said alcohol wasn't involved. But he backtracked Friday.

"Did guys have a drink? I'm sure they did," he said.

Rivers didn't indicate whether Griffin will be punished by the Clippers.

## BYLAW #4308 TO AMEND BYLAW 3691 THE RANCLANDS PHASE 3 CONCEPTUAL SCHEME & BYLAW 4168 LAND USE BYLAW

The municipal council of the City of Medicine Hat gave First Reading on Monday, January 18th, 2016 to Bylaw #4308 to amend Bylaw #3691, the Ranchlands phase 3 Conceptual Scheme, and Bylaw #4168, the City of Medicine Hat Land Use Bylaw.

**WHEREAS** the land within the Ranchlands Phase 3 Conceptual Scheme Amendment is legally described as a portion of SE ¼ Section 8; Twp 13; Rge 5; W4M, Plan 6164JK Block B and Plan 0910426 Block 15, Lot 6 (hereinafter referred to as the "subject land") is presently designated as FUD, Future Urban Development District and R-MD, Medium Density Residential in the City of Medicine Hat Land Use Bylaw.

The role of the Investment Advisory Panel is to provide advice to City of Medicine Hat regarding the City's equity investments; annually review the City's Equity Investment Policy #0157; review the City's Equity Investment Portfolio quarterly; and consult with the City with insights on investment opportunities.

Currently, the City of Medicine Hat has an opportunity for an individual outside of the City's organization to join this Panel. The Investment Advisory Panel will consist of the Corporate Services Commissioner, General Manager of Finance and up to three (3) members of City of Medicine Hat Administration. Up to two (2) external members can be included in the Panel.

Members are appointed by the Corporate Services Commissioner for a term of up to three years in length. This is a volunteer position and the annual time commitment would consist of four quarterly meetings with the possibility of an occasional special meeting.

- Highly knowledgeable in investment policy and investment implementation strategies.

## BYLAW #4339 TO AUTHORIZE THE CITY TO LEASE TO THE MEDICINE HAT FOOD BANK

TAKE NOTICE that City Council gave First Reading on Monday January 18, 2016 to Bylaw #4339, a Bylaw of the City of Medicine Hat to lease to the Medicine Hat and District Food Bank (1992) Association ("the MH Food Bank") an approximately 3,000 square foot portion of environmental reserve land for use as a Community Garden. The environmental reserve land is legally described as: Plan 9212624, Block 35, Lot 7ER (ENVIRONMENTAL RESERVE) excepting thereout all mines and minerals.

**WHEREAS** the MH Food Bank is a non-profit Alberta Society duly incorporated in Alberta;

**AND WHEREAS** section 676(1) (c) of the Municipal Government Act, R.S.A. 2000, as amended, authorizes a municipality to lease an environmental reserve for a term of not more than 3 years.

**AND WHEREAS** the City and MH Food Bank have entered into a lease agreement ("the Lease Agreement") to lease the ER Land to the MH Food Bank for use as a Community Garden, and such Lease Agreement is subject to and conditional upon Council passing a bylaw to so lease the ER Land to the MH Food Bank;

**AND WHEREAS** no permanent structure shall be constructed on the ER Land;

**AND WHEREAS** Council considers that the lease of the ER Land to the MH Food Bank will benefit the City and the City's residents.

This Bylaw shall come into force at the beginning of the day that it is passed.

## PROTECT WATER LINES FROM FREEZING

The following actions should be considered to protect your water lines.

1. Repair broken windows and ensure windows/vents are closed during the winter.
2. Insulate water pipes in unheated areas, include crawl spaces.
3. For sinks located against a non-insulated outside wall:
  - Open the vanity door to allow warm air to reach the water pipes.
  - A light bulb placed near the water pipe may generate enough heat to keep the water flowing.
  - Heat tape wrapped around the pipe may keep the pipe from freezing.
4. For Residents of mobile homes
  - check the condition of the heat tape on their water service and meter
  - protect unheated indoor water meter with an insulated box
  - water pipes should be wrapped in insulation using heat tape
  - Outside water taps and underground sprinkler systems should have the water supply shut off inside the house at the isolation valve for the tap
  - Sprinkler lines and taps should be drained/blown out
5. A thin stream of water (as thick as a pencil lead) running continuously from at least one tap will help prevent a frozen water service.
6. If you plan to be away from home over the winter period, close the main water isolation valve in your home. This is located next to your water meter.

A frozen water service, or a burst water pipe, is an inconvenience and expense that most people would like to avoid. Please take precautions to prevent this happening in your home or business.
