

## Japan leads field at home

**TOKYO**  
World champion Yuzuru Hanyu finished first in the free skate as Japan maintained its lead in the figure skating World Team Trophy on Friday.  
Hanyu received 200.9 points for a routine that featured four quadruple jumps. Compatriot Shomu Uno finished second with 198.49 as Japan improved to 81 points in the six-nation competition.  
The United States was second with 78, followed by Russia with 74 and Canada with 67.  
Toronto's Patrick Chan finished third in the free skate with 190.74 points while Nathan Chen of the U.S. was fourth with 185.24.  
France's Vanessa James and Morgan Cipres won the pairs short program while Kaitlyn Weaver and Andrew Poje of Waterloo, Ont., were first in the ice dancing free program.  
Kirsten Moore-Towers of St. Catharines, Ont., and Michael Marinaro of Sarnia, Ont., were third in the pairs.

# Giovinco steals the show

**TORONTO**  
On a night when German star Bastian Schweinsteiger came to town, Sebastian Giovinco served a reminder that he is still the main attraction.  
The diminutive Italian scored two goals - and likely could have had five - as Toronto FC defeated the Chicago Fire 3-1 Friday, handing Schweinsteiger his first loss in Major League Soccer.  
Giovinco upped his season goal total to three, punctuating the victory with a glorious free kick to the top corner in the 82nd minute. But his eye-popping performance came with a major-league tantrum.

trick, the Atomic Ant was not happy to be taken off in the 85th minute, slapping a stanchion in disgust as he headed directly to the dressing room.

Giovinco, who had not had much luck in front of goal in his five previous games, had showered and left the building by the time reporters were allowed in

the dressing room.  
Toronto coach Greg Vanney said later he was trying to do the right thing in taking the Italian off.  
He wanted an extra midfielder on to help do the dirty defensive work in the dying minutes. He also wanted to give another player some minutes, saying "We've got 30 guys who train their butts off every single week."  
Eriq Zavaleta also scored for Toronto (2-1-4) while Spanish playmaker Victor Vazquez notched his fourth assist of the season, pulling the strings in his 66 minutes of action before 27,097 at BMO Field.  
Substitute David Accam pulled a goal back for Chicago in the 88th minute. It was the Fire's only shot on target.

## Canada's Kyle announces retirement from soccer

**TORONTO**  
Midfielder Kaylyn Kyle, who won 101 caps for Canada and a bronze medal at the London Olympics, has retired from international soccer.  
The 28-year-old from Saskatoon made the announcement via social media, calling it a bittersweet day.  
"I have been able to represent Canada over 100 times at the highest level," she said. "Playing in two under-20 World Cups, two Women's World Cups, an Olympic Games, Pan American Games and many more

tournaments along the way.  
"Thank you for the incredible ride!"

Kyle last played for Canada on home soil at the 2015 World Cup, winning her 100th cap coming off the bench against Switzerland before appearing a substitute in the quarter-final loss to England. She was a non-travelling alternate for the Canadian team that won bronze

at last summer's Rio Olympics.  
"I don't think I'm done playing for Canada at all. I think I still have a few more years left in me," she said prior to Rio. "It's just keep working hard here and keep performing with my club so I can get called back in."

But Kyle was released by the Orlando Pride of the NWSL prior to this season after she was not

one of the Canadians allocated to the league — meaning subsidized — by the Canadian Soccer Association.

Kyle, who was 19 when she made her debut for Canada in January 2008, played in a career-high 62 consecutive Canada matches in 2011 to 2014.

In London, the energetic midfielder started two games and came off the bench for four more in Canada's bronze-medal run at the 2012 Games.

An entrepreneur off the field, Kyle has worked with headphone manufacturer Beats by Dre, Under Armour and Golazo, an organic drink company based in Seattle. She also runs soccer camps.

Kyle's father, Doug, played hockey, scoring 55 goals and adding 58 assists for a 1983-84 Saskatoon Blades team that included Wendel Clark and Joey Kocur. He signed with the Edmonton Oilers but, unable to crack a championship roster, spent three seasons in the International Hockey League.

## RIVERSIDE GAS DISTRIBUTION REPLACEMENT PROJECT STARTS MAY 1, 2017



Medicine Hat – The City of Medicine Hat Gas Utility will be replacing gas mains and house services to ensure the safe and reliable delivery of natural gas to citizens.

This project which started last year is set to resume on May 1, 2017 and expected to take approximately 6-8 weeks, depending on weather and unforeseen circumstances.

During construction it will become necessary at certain times to install temporary traffic controls and detours to maintain the safety of the public and the construction personnel on site. Please adhere to all construction signage to ensure the work can be completed in a timely manner.

## FIRE HYDRANT & WATER MAIN FLUSHING

Environmental Utilities performs regular, routine maintenance to uphold the water quality and system infrastructure by annually testing and flushing fire hydrants and water mains.

In some areas of the City during these flushing operations, there may be some discoloration in the water which is not harmful to consume and will disappear when flushing is complete. Please note that discolored water should not be used for laundry and fluctuating water pressure may also be noticed.

Should discoloration persist beyond three hours, turn on your cold water tap and let the water run for 5-20 minutes or until the water runs clear.
