

Nadal, Raonic ousted in quarters

ROME

Rafael Nadal's winning streak ended at 17 matches as he lost to Dominic Thiem in the quarter-finals of the Italian Open on Friday while Canadian Milos Raonic bowed out in straight sets to Alexander Zverev.

Venus Williams is also out of the tournament after the American was defeated 6-2, 3-6, 6-2 by third seed Garbine Muguruza of Spain.

Thiem's 6-4, 6-3 victory came after he was beaten by the Spaniard in the Madrid Open final last week.

Raonic, meanwhile, pushed his 16th-seeded opponent to a tiebreaker in the opening set before dropping a 7-6 (1), 6-1 decision. Zverev needed 89 minutes to complete the victory over the No. 5 seed from Thornhill, Ont.

Dreaming of a triple crown bid

Always Dreaming has run away from the competition in four consecutive victories this year, winning by a combined 23 1/4 lengths.

The dark bay colt was never challenged in winning the Kentucky Derby by 2 3/4 lengths on a sloppy track at Churchill Downs.

Whether he does it again in the 1 3/16-mile Preakness at Pimlico on Saturday depends on a good trip, the tactics by his nine rivals and a little luck. Always Dreaming is the early 4-5 favourite under jockey John Velazquez.

"Always Dreaming hasn't had many obstacles to face," said Corey Lanerie, who will ride Derby runner-up Lookin At Lee. "Maybe he's that good that he won't encounter trouble. But you never know."

After three consecutive days of 90-plus-degree heat, the forecast calls for a high of 68 and cloudy skies Saturday when the race goes off about 6:48 p.m. EDT.

Always Dreaming is a victory away from setting up a bid for the Triple Crown. Two years ago, American Pharoah became the first horse to sweep the Derby, Preakness and Belmont in 37 years.

"I'm someone who has been in a lot of races and lost a lot of races, so I know you don't want to be overconfident," trainer Todd Pletcher said, "but I do feel very, very good about the way he's coming into it."

In the Preakness, Always Dreaming will break from the No. 4 post, a spot that has produced 13 winners but none since Curlin in 2007. One spot over on his outside will be Classic Empire, last year's 2-year-old champion who finished fourth in the Derby after getting knocked around coming out of the starting gate.

"If anything, I have a greater respect for Always Dreaming," said Mark Casse, who trains Classic Empire. "I think he's going to be tougher to beat than I thought he would be going into the Derby."

As the Derby champ, Always Dreaming will have a bulls-eye on his back in a smaller field going a shorter distance than two weeks ago.

Canadians square off in French final

Norwegian star striker Ada Hegerberg scored in the eighth round of a penalty shootout Friday to help Lyon edge Paris Saint-Germain 2-1 in a French Cup women's soccer final featuring two Canadians.

Wingback Ashley Lawrence started for PSG while Kadeisha Buchanan was in the Lyon starting 11.

For league champion Lyon, it's a sixth straight Cup win. The two teams face off again June 1 in Cardiff in the UEFA Women's Champions League final.

Saki Kumagai scored for Lyon and Cristiane for PSG. With the game tied 1-1 after regulation time, the contest went straight to a shootout.

Lawrence and Buchanan, both 21, grew up playing together in Brampton, Ont., and shared the field at West Virginia University.

CART COLLECTION TIPS

SureGrow is a Class "A" soil amendment that greatly enhances the overall soil structure and improves movement of air and water within the soil, which is essential to healthy plant growth.

SureGrow compost can be purchased at the Waste Management Facility Scale House for \$5.00 per 20 litre bag or in bulk quantities for \$28.00 per tonne. Bulk compost must be self-loaded into a pickup truck or trailer. Additional loader fees apply for all tandem loads.

BYLAW #4436 – CITY LOAN GUARANTEE

ROYAL BANK AND THE MEDICINE HAT GOLF & COUNTRY CLUB

TAKE NOTICE that the Medicine Hat City Council, in the Province of Alberta has given first reading to Bylaw #4436. This bylaw will upon final passage and approval, authorize the designated City officers to execute a guarantee to the Royal Bank of Canada (the "Bank") for the repayment of a loan between the Bank and the Medicine Hat Golf & Country Club (the "Club").

WHEREAS:

- The Club is a non-profit Recreation Public Company under the Companies Act (Alberta).
- The Club leases land, a clubhouse and other improvements from the City for the purposes of operating a golf course (the "Golf Course") for the benefit of its members, the City and the general public pursuant to a lease agreement dated August 21, 2001, as amended by an Amending Agreement dated August 20, 2002, as further amended by an Amending Agreement dated October 16, 2007, as further amended by an Amending Agreement dated August 4, 2010 as further amended by an Amending Agreement executed by the City on November 7, 2012, and as extended to December 31, 2020 by way of letter dated November 16, 2010 (collectively called the "Lease Agreement").
- The Club desires to replace the 9th and 10th greens at the Golf Course (Phase 2 of the Green re-building/surfacing project) (the "Greens Replacement Project") for an estimated cost of \$175,000 plus contingency.
- The Club has raised \$85,000 towards the cost of the Greens Replacement Project and wishes to borrow the remaining \$100,000 from the Bank to finance the Greens Replacement Project (the "Loan").
- The Club has requested that the City guarantee the Loan from the Bank to allow the Club to obtain a lower interest rate for the Loan.
- In the event that the Club defaults on the Loan and the City is required to pay money under the guarantee, the City desires to have the option to terminate the Lease Agreement.
- Council considers that the guarantee to the Bank on behalf of the Club will be used for a purpose that will benefit the City.

NOW THEREFORE NOTICE is hereby given by the Council of the City of Medicine Hat that, unless a poll of the electors is demanded, as provided for by the terms of Section 231 of the Municipal Government Act, the said Council may pass the said borrowing bylaw.

The petition for a vote must be received by the City Clerk within 15 days of the last publication of this notice, which is **May 27, 2017**, and shall contain on each page "an accurate and identical statement of the purpose and objectives of the petition". (Further conditions of the petition are described in the Municipal Government Act, Sections 219 to 226.)

FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that a copy of the proposed bylaw may be inspected by the public during normal office hours (8:30 AM to 4:30 PM) at the City Clerk Department, Third Floor, City Hall, 580 First Street, SE, Medicine Hat, Alberta.

FIRE HYDRANT & WATER MAIN FLUSHING

Environmental Utilities performs regular, routine maintenance to uphold the water quality and system infrastructure by annually testing and flushing fire hydrants and water mains.

In some areas of the City during these flushing operations, there may be some discoloration in the water which is not harmful to consume and will disappear when flushing is complete. Please note that discolored water should not be used for laundry and fluctuating water pressure may also be noticed.

Should discoloration persist beyond three hours, turn on your cold water tap and let the water run for 5-20 minutes or until the water runs clear.
