

Gold sweet for Canada's Arendz

After Mark Arendz missed the top of the Paralympic medal podium four years ago in Sochi, he harnessed that frustration in every training session.

The 28-year-old from Hartsville, P.E.I., won biathlon's standing 15-kilometre event in Pyeongchang on Friday, finally capturing the one medal missing from his Paralympic collection. It was his fourth medal of these Games.

"All week, every time I step on that podium, I was thinking to myself that I want to hear those words 'Paralympic champion' and then my name, and then hear the anthem," Arendz said. "I've seen the Maple Leaf on that podium a few times now with teammates, but to

finally be up there myself with that anthem, that's going to be an amazing feeling."

His medal boosted Canada's total to 19, tying the team's best-ever performance from Vancouver in 2010, and three better than the team won four years ago in Sochi — with two days of competition remaining. With Canada's Para hockey team facing the U.S. in Sunday's final, Canada is guaranteed a best-ever finish.

Arendz, who lost his left arm after he toppled into a grain auger on his family farm at the age of seven, missed gold four years ago in Sochi by just seven tenths of a second.

Arendz shot a perfect 20-for-20, and finished in 42 minutes 52.2 seconds. Benjamin Daviet of France took the silver in 43:50.5, while Norway's Nils-Erik Ulset was third (44:06.7).

Curling team settles for bronze

Canada's curling team has won bronze at the Pyeongchang Paralympics. Mark Ideson, Ina Forrest, Dennis Thiessen and Marie Wright edged South Korea 5-3 in Saturday's bronze-medal game.

It's not the medal the Canadians were hoping for, as Canada had swept the gold medals since the sport made its Paralympic debut in 2006 in Turin.

Their medal boosted Canada's best-ever total to 22 at these Games.

The Canadians took the ice barely 12 hours after a

heartbreaking last-shot loss to China in the semifinals.

Canada, South Korea and China all went 9-2 to finish the preliminary round tied atop the standings.

Wright, a 57-year-old single mother of four daughters from Moose Jaw, Sask., was the lone rookie on this Paralympic team. Forrest, from Armstrong, B.C., is already a two-time Paralympic gold medallist. Ideson, from Ideson, Ont., and Thiessen, from Sanford, Man., were on the team that won gold in Sochi.

The Chinese faced Norway for gold later Saturday.

BYLAW NO. 4473 TO REPEAL BYLAW NO. 4226

TAKE NOTICE that City Council gave First Reading on Monday, March 5, 2018 to Bylaw #4473, a Bylaw of the City of Medicine Hat to repeal Bylaw #4226, in the amount of \$1,700,000 which was passed on May 6, 2014 for the purpose of River Ridge Sanitary Lift Station Replacement.

Whereas:

- It is considered desirable to repeal Bylaw #4226.

NOW THEREFORE THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MEDICINE HAT, IN COUNCIL ASSEMBLED, ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- Bylaw #4226 is repealed.
- This Bylaw comes into force at the beginning of the day that it is passed.

AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that, unless a sufficient petition demanding a poll of the electors is received within 15 days following the date of the last publication of this Notice, the Council may pass the repealing bylaw on April 16, 2018 as described in the Municipal Government Act, Sections 219 to 226.

PROTECT WATER LINES FROM FREEZING

The following actions should be considered to protect your water lines:

- Repair broken windows and ensure windows/vents are closed during the winter.
- Insulate water pipes in unheated areas, including crawl spaces.
- For sinks located against a non-insulated outside wall:
 - Open the vanity door to allow warm air to reach the water pipes.
 - A light bulb placed near the water pipe may generate enough heat to keep the water flowing
 - Heat tape wrapped around the pipe may keep the pipe from freezing.
- Residents of mobile homes should check the condition of the heat tape on their water service and water meter.
- Protect unheated indoor water meter with an insulated box and water pipes should be wrapped in insulation using heat tape.
- Outside water taps and underground sprinkler systems should have the water supply shut off inside the house at the isolation valve for the tap.
- Sprinkler lines and taps should be drained/blown out.
- A thin stream of water (as thick as a pencil lead) running continuously from at least one tap will help prevent a frozen water service.
- If you plan to be away from home over the winter period, close the main water isolation valve located next to the water meter in your home. You should leave the heat on in your home and have someone check inside your home daily while you're away.

A frozen water service, or a burst water pipe, is an inconvenience and expense that most people would like to avoid. Please take all possible precautions to prevent this happening in your home or business.

PUBLIC NOTICE OF ROAD CLOSURE PUBLIC UTILITY LOT (PUL) - 10 STREET SE

The municipal council of the City of the Medicine Hat gave First Reading to Bylaw #4474 on Monday, March 5, 2018, a road closure bylaw. The PUL lane at the west end of 10 Street SE that connects the rear lane with 10 Street SE has never been designated as a road right-of-way but has been used by the public for vehicle traffic for many years. The PUL lane is not required and properties in the area will still have access from the front street and back lane. Closure of the PUL lane will divert resources previously used to maintain the lane to lanes in other areas of the city.
