

Hoffman, fiancée deny cyberbullying wife of Karlsson

Ottawa Senators forward Mike Hoffman and his fiancée Monika Caryk say they have nothing to do with the cyberbullying of Melinda Karlsson, the wife of Senators captain Erik Karlsson.

The couple told Postmedia Ottawa on Friday that they feel for the Karlssons and want to help them find the person responsible.

Caryk said she has hired a lawyer to work with the Karlssons and the Senators to conduct a third-party investigation, adding the couple has nothing to hide.

In an application for a peace bond filed May 4 in an Ottawa court, Melinda

Karlsson alleged that Caryk posted hundreds of derogatory online messages aimed at her and her husband.

The Karlssons were subjected to trolling posts on Erik's Instagram account after their first child was stillborn in March.

Hoffman said he reached out to Erik Karlsson to try to resolve the situation, but didn't hear anything back.

A representative from Hoffman's player agency — Octagon — told The Canadian Press they will not be commenting further on the matter at this time.

Caryk's lawyer, Sheila Block of Torsys LLP, did not immediately respond for comment.

Only Canadian woman to have name engraved on Stanley Cup, Sonia Scurfield, dies at age 89

CALGARY Sonia Scurfield, the only Canadian woman to have her name engraved on the Stanley Cup, has died at Foothills Hospital in Calgary at the age of 89.

Her death was announced late Thursday by Sunshine Village ski resort, which is owned by her family.

"It is with a heavy heart that we relay the passing of Sonia Scurfield, the matriarch of the Scurfield family," the ski resort wrote on Facebook. "She will be sorely missed."

Born Sonia Onishenko in

September 1928, she married Ralph Scurfield in Edmonton in 1954.

The family purchased Sunshine Village in Banff National Park in 1981 and turned it into a winter ski destination.

Ralph Scurfield was also one of the founding owners of the Flames when they brought the team to Calgary from Atlanta in 1980. His wife took it over after he died in an avalanche while heli-skiing in 1985.

"After the funeral, my mother said, 'You have to go to the game,'" Scurfield, who had cancer, recalled in a recent interview with Sportsnet.

A wanted man

Marlies coach Keefe turning NHL heads after Calder Cup win

Toronto Marlies head coach Sheldon Keefe didn't care to talk about his future moments after winning the Calder Cup.

All he wanted was to celebrate his team's accomplishment before having to think about his own career.

"I'm gonna party my (butt) off tonight and not think about anything else beyond that," Keefe said on Thursday after his Marlies downed the visiting Texas Stars 6-1 in Game 7 of the American Hockey League championship series.

Leading a team to an AHL title historically has boded well for a coach's future if the plan is to jump to the NHL, whether it be an assistant's role or head coach.

Including Bill Barber, who won a Calder Cup in 1998 and was named head coach with the Philadelphia Flyers in 2000, 13 of the past 19 Calder Cup-winning head coaches before Keefe went on to become an NHL head coach.

If you add in Minnesota's Bob Woods and Todd Nelson, who was recently hired by the Dallas Stars as an assistant coach after winning the 2017 Calder Cup, it jumps to 15 coaches to receive an NHL gig shortly after winning an AHL championship.

Toronto Maple Leafs general manager Kyle Dubas, who

hired Keefe to coach the Marlies in 2015 after solidifying a relationship together with the Ontario Hockey League's Sault Ste. Marie Greyhounds, knows his 37-year-old bench boss could be in demand this off-season after bringing Toronto its first Calder Cup.

"I'm very happy for Sheldon, I think he's a very talented coach, continues to get better and it's a very gratifying experience to see the continued development on his part," said Dubas ahead of the Calder Cup final.

"I know his future is very, very bright."

Stanley Cup champion Barry Trotz has an AHL championship from 1994. Nashville's Peter Laviolette won one in 1999 and Edmonton's Todd

McLellan put his name on the Calder Cup in 2003.

Tampa Bay's Jon Cooper is one of nine current NHL head coaches with a Calder Cup championship on their resume.

He led the Norfolk Admirals in a four-game sweep over the Marlies in 2012 to win the Calder Cup and was eventually promoted from within the Lightning organization.

Toronto was coached then by Dallas Eakins, who also got an NHL shot with the Edmonton Oilers.

"I think it's hard to say one way or another how you get a chance at the NHL level," said Eakins, who now coaches the AHL's San Diego Gulls.

"I'm not sure there's a clear path but one thing I know for sure is winning never hurts."

WATER MAIN FLUSHING & FIRE HYDRANT INSPECTIONS

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE LAND USE BYLAW #4168 2055 HOLSOM ROAD SW

TAKE NOTICE that City Council gave First Reading on Tuesday, June 5, 2018 to Bylaw #4489, a Bylaw of the City of Medicine Hat to amend the Land Use Bylaw #4168 to rezone the subject land from Direct Control (DC) to Business Industrial (I-B).

The purpose of this Bylaw amendment is to allow the property owners to upgrade their property with minor improvements including lighting, fencing and regrading without extra permitting costs and a lengthy approval process as required by DC zoning. The DC zoning is no longer required for this property as the area is now protected by the Airport Zoning Regulation Bylaw.

A Public Hearing in general accordance with the Municipal Government Act and the City's Procedure Bylaw, and consideration of the Second/Third Readings of proposed Bylaw #4489 will be held in the City Hall Council Chambers at the address below on Tuesday, July 3, 2018, beginning at approximately 6:30 pm. Any person who claims to be affected by the proposed bylaw may make representation to City Council at the Public Hearing. Oral submissions are limited to five minutes.
