

Another champion gone at Wimbledon

LONDON
Venus Williams became the latest former champion to be knocked out at Wimbledon.
Her sister Serena is still going strong, though, after overcoming her toughest test so far this week.
In the men's tournament, Roger Federer's latest victory never looked in doubt as he won 37 of 40 first-serve points and stretched his Wimbledon winning streak to 29 sets, beating Jan-Lennard Struff of Germany 6-3, 7-5, 6-2.
The eight-time champion and No. 1 seed next faces 22nd-seeded Adrian Panatta of France, who

beat Daniil Medvedev 6-4, 6-3, 4-6, 5-7, 6-3.
Venus couldn't complete a third consecutive comeback as she lost to 20th-seeded Kiki Bertens of the Netherlands 6-2, 6-7 (5), 8-6 in the third round on Friday.
"Just ran out of time in the end," Venus said. "She played really well. You have to win the last point, and I didn't succeed in that today."
She is the fourth former women's champion to get knocked out, joining Maria Sharapova, Petra Kvitová and last year's winner Garbine Muguruza.
That leaves Serena as the only remaining woman to have won the tournament. The seven-time champion came from a break down in the

first set to get past Kristina Mladenovic 7-5, 7-6 (2).
Venus had rallied from a set down in her first two matches. Her exit means eight of the top 10 seeded women have gone out before the end of Week 1.
The 38-year-old American, last year's runner-up, was the oldest women's singles entrant in 2018.
Serena took her Wimbledon winning streak to 17 matches, thanks in part to 13 aces. She missed last year's tournament while pregnant.
She faces another mother in the fourth round Monday: 120th-ranked qualifier Evgeniya Rodina of Russia, who upset No. 10 seed Madison Keys of the U.S.

Doubles match goes long

After being knocked out in the second round of the men's doubles on Friday, Cameron Norrie's biggest disappointment was falling short of a Wimbledon record.
The British player and countryman Jay Clarke came up short in a three-day, 87-game, 5-hour, 2-minute first-round marathon against Hans Podlipnik-Castillo of Chile and his Argentine partner Marcelo Arevalo.
The 6-4, 6-7 (5), 5-7, 6-4, 22-20 scoreline left the match tied for the fifth-most games in men's doubles at Wimbledon, 15 short of the 102 played when Marcelo Melo and Andre Sa defeated Kevin Ullyett and Paul Hanley 28-26 in the fifth set of their second-round encounter in 2007.

WATER MAIN FLUSHING & FIRE HYDRANT INSPECTIONS

Environmental Utilities performs regular, routine maintenance to uphold the water quality and system infrastructure by annually flushing water mains and inspecting fire hydrants.

During these operations, there may be some discoloration in the water which is not harmful to consume and will disappear when flushing is complete. Please note that discoloured water should not be used for laundry and that fluctuating water pressure may also be noticed.

Should discoloration persist beyond three hours, turn on your cold water tap or an outside sprinkler and let the water run for several minutes until the water runs clear.

BYLAW #4493 PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE LAND USE BYLAW #4168 501 7 AVENUE SW

TAKE NOTICE that City Council gave First Reading on Tuesday, July 3, 2018 to Bylaw #4493, a Bylaw of the City of Medicine Hat to amend the Land Use Bylaw #4168 to rezone the subject land from Low Density Residential (R-LD) District to Neighbourhood Commercial (C-N) District. The purpose of this Bylaw amendment is to allow for the existing single detached house on the property to be redeveloped as a Denture Clinic.

A Public Hearing in general accordance with the Municipal Government Act and the City's Procedure Bylaw, and consideration of the Second/Third Readings of proposed Bylaw #4493 will be held in the City Hall Council Chambers at the address below on Monday, August 20, 2018, beginning at approximately 6:30 pm. Any person who claims to be affected by the proposed bylaw may make representation to City Council at the Public Hearing. Oral submissions are limited to five minutes.

GAS, ELECTRIC, WIND ENERGY RATES SET FOR JULY

Medicine Hat - The City of Medicine Hat has set its July energy commodity rates.

Natural Gas

The July natural gas commodity rate of \$2.354 per gigajoule (GJ), up from \$1.567 per gigajoule (GJ) in June, for all customers is based on the average of the monthly gas charges set by Alberta gas distribution (pipes) owners.

Effective January 1, 2018 the City of Medicine Hat will calculate the Monthly Reference Price based on the average of the rates approved by the Alberta Utilities Commission.

Electricity

The July electricity rate of \$0.06800 per kilowatt hour, up from \$0.05795 per kilowatt hour in June, for Residential, Farm, Small and Medium Commercial, Unmetered Services and Rental Lighting, is based on the average of the rates for owners whose regulated rate tariffs are approved by the Alberta Utilities Commission under section 103(2) of the Electric Utilities Act for that calendar month as posted by the Alberta Utilities Commission on its internet page under Regulated Rate Option Regulation.

In November 2016 the Government of Alberta announced a plan to cap the Regulated Rate Option at 6.8 cents per kilowatt hour. City of Medicine Hat electric utility customers are protected under Ministerial Order 149/2017. During the period of January 1, 2018 - May 31, 2021 Residential, Farm, Small and Medium Commercial, Unmetered Services and Rental Lighting customers will pay the lower of the Market Reference Price or the rate ceiling of 6.8 cents per kilowatt hour. The rate will automatically be applied to consumer's bills that are on the regulated rate.

Effective January 1, 2018 the City of Medicine Hat will calculate the Monthly Reference Price based on the average of the rates using the four Regulated Rate Option providers approved by the Alberta Utilities Commission under section 103(2) of the Electric Utilities Act. This calculation aligns with the Regulated Rate Cap Regulation.

The July default electricity rate for Large Commercial, Industrial and Street Lighting customers is based on the monthly average Alberta Power Pool price as established and published by the Alberta Electric System Operator (AESO) plus \$0.02 per kilowatt hour. The rate for June was \$0.08344 per kilowatt hour.

The Electric Utility also offers a fixed electric commodity price for Residential, Farm, Small and Medium Commercial customers. The fixed rate for 2018 is \$0.0680 per kilowatt hour.

The Gas Utility offers a fixed natural gas commodity price for all rate class customers. The fixed rate for 2018 is \$5.80 per gigajoule (GJ).

Going Green Charge

Customers also have a "Going Green" surcharge on their bill. This surcharge is for renewable energy purchased for residential, farm, small and medium commercial customers.

The Going Green surcharge is calculated monthly to recover costs incurred to purchase renewable energy.

The Going Green surcharge for July is \$0.0010 per kilowatt hour.
