Olympian Humphries fed up, leaving Canada

Bobsled champion claims coach harrasment, pursuing move to U.S.

Kaillie Humphries says Canada's governing body of bobsled has left her no other option than to compete for another country.
The two-time Olympic champion is suing Bobsleigh Canada Skeleton in an effort to obtain her release and race for the United States.
"I didn't choose to leave," Humphries told The Canadian Press in an email Friday. "I'm being pushed

out because I filed a harassment complaint."
"They stripped me of funding, support and forced me into this decision."
The 34-year-old Calgarian filed a harassment complaint with BCS last year.
In accordance with its harassment policy, the organization brought in an independent third-party to review the complaint and that review is still ongoing.
Humphries revealed the nature of her complaint Friday saying she was "repeatedly and horribly verbally and mentally abused by the head coach of Bobsleigh Canada."

"I have repeatedly told Bobsleigh Canada, who has done nothing to stop him, protect me, or get a timely resolve so I can be back competing."
"I was forced back to working with him multiple times, which resulted in major mental health issues over this past year."

Todd Hays, formerly coach of the U.S. women's bobsled team from 2011 to 2014, has been Canada's head coach since 2017.

BCS's response was to refer to a statement issued Thursday night.

"Bobsleigh Canada Skeleton abides by its harassment and discrimination policy that has been in place since 2006," BCS said.

"The Alberta litigation matter by Ms. Humphries, the plaintiff, which names Bobsleigh Canada Skeleton as the defendant, is the subject of an open court process."

"As for the investigation of Ms. Humphries' discrimination and harassment complaint made under the policy, we can't provide any comments since this investigation is strictly private and confidential as provided in the policy. We look forward to the findings of the complaint review."

Humphries piloted Canada to Olympic gold in 2010 and 2014 with brakewoman Heather Moyse, making them the first to repeat as Olympic women's bobsled champions.

The duo carried Canada's flag in the closing ceremony of the 2014 Winter Games in Sochi, Russia. Humphries and Phylicia George claimed bronze in 2018.

Humphries dominated international women's bobsled, winning four overall World Cup titles in a span of six seasons.

She also became the first woman to drive an all-female crew against men in a four-man World Cup bobsled race in 2016. Humphries has lobbied for women to get their own four-person races at the Olympic Games.

But she did not race for Canada last season after lodging her harassment complaint with BCS in August, 2018.

Humphries will marry American bobsledder Travis Armbruster on Saturday, which would allow her to represent the U.S. in competition if she is released by Canada, according to The Associated Press.

U.S. closes gap at Solheim Cup

The Europeans have the lead. The Americans have the momentum.

An opening day of swinging fortunes in the Solheim Cup reached a crescendo in a tension-filled last hour at Gleneagles, with the final two matches of the fourballs going to the 18th hole and the U.S. team staring at a three-point deficit.

Two long birdie putts later, first from Lexi Thompson then from Brittany Altomare, the U.S. had escaped with two half-points and only trailed Europe 4 1/2-3 1/2.

As shadows lengthened across the PGA Centenary Course, it was the U.S. players and their flag-waving fans who were cheering the loudest.

"You keep gnawing a half-point here and a point there, and it adds up," said U.S. captain Juli Inkster, who cut an animated figure beside the 18th green as Day 1 drew to a close.

"You look at all the golf today and we're only a point down. So I'm very pleased with where we're at right now."

The Americans, who lead the overall series 10-5, are looking for a third straight win in the biggest team event in women's golf but a first in three attempts in Scotland after losses in 1992 and 2000.

Chappell shoots 11-under 59 at The Greenbrier

Last fall, Kevin Chappell was at home recuperating from back surgery. On Friday in his first PGA Tour event since surgery, he had the 11th sub-60 round in tour history.

Chappell shot an 11-under 59 in the second round of A Military Tribute at The Greenbrier. He missed a 10-foot birdie putt on the par-4 ninth to fall a stroke short of Jim Furyk's tour record.

"I was trying to keep the mindset, keep the foot on the gas and attack," Chappell said. "All in all, couldn't be happier with where I'm at."

A day after shooting a 71, Chappell opened with a par on No. 10, then birdied the next eight to make the turn in 28. He birdied No. 1 to tie the PGA Tour record for consecutive birdies set by Mark Calcavecchia in the 2009 Canadian Open, and got to 11 under with birdies on Nos. 5 and 7.

Furyk set the record in 2016 with a 58 in the final round of the Travelers Championship.

PUBLIC NOTICE OF ROAD CLOSURE PLAN: 1911516 PORTION OF TAYLOR AVENUE SE (ADJACENT TO SEWER LIFT STATION)

The municipal council of the City of the Medicine Hat gave First Reading on Tuesday, September 3, 2019 to Bylaw #4599, a road closure bylaw. The purpose of Bylaw #4599 is to close the portion of Taylor Avenue SE adjacent to the existing sewer lift station. The closed portion of the road would be consolidated with the existing lift station site to allow for the expansion of the sewer lift station.
