Brown, De Grasse move on

DOHA, Qatar
Canadians Andre De Grasse and Aaron Brown have advanced to the semifinals in the men's 100 metres at the world track and field championships.
De Grasse, a three-time Olympic medallist from Markham, Ont., was second in his heat on the opening day of the worlds on Friday, finish-

ing in 10.13 seconds. Two-time world champion Justin Gatlin of the United States won in 10.06 seconds.

Toronto's Brown also was second in his heat in 10.16 seconds. Akani Simbine of South Africa was first at 10.01.

The top three in each heat and the next six fastest advanced to Saturday's semifinals. The final is also Saturday.

Meanwhile, Alysha Newman of London, Ont., qualified for the women's pole vault final. Newman cleared the qualifying height of 4.60 metres to advance to Sunday's final.

Genevieve Lalonde of Moncton, N.B., advanced to the final in the women's 3,000-metre steeplechase. Lalonde was seventh in her heat and 15th overall with a time of 9 minutes 30.01 seconds.

In the men's 5,000, Mohammed Ahmed of St. Catharines, Ont., and Toronto's Justyn Knight qualified for the final. Ahmed was fourth in his heat and 12th overall in 13:25.35, while Knight was ninth in his heat and 14th overall in 13:25.95

Lindsey Butterworth of North Vancouver, B.C., qualified for the semis in the women's 800 metres. She was fourth in her heat and eighth overall with a time of 2:01.64.

Worlds open in Qatar

When the world track and field championships opened in the Middle East for the first time Friday, there were some noticeable absences: Usain Bolt, Caster Semenya, Russian flags and fans.

The 40,000-seat stadium — the first open-air venue of its kind with air conditioning — was cooling thousands of empty seats Friday night, many of them covered by enormous canvas signs.

Perhaps more tickets would have been sold if Usain Bolt, the sport's most charismatic figure who has been at every world championships since 2003, had not retired after the 2017 event. His absence opens the door for American sprinters Christian Coleman and Justin Gatlin, both tainted by doping cases. Gatlin's doping issues were from years ago, but Coleman had a case against him for missing tests dropped just two weeks ago because of a technicality. Both men cruised through heats in the 100 metres to qualify for the semifinals Saturday

Back on the track for the first time since news of the missed doping tests emerged, Coleman qualified fastest, starting strongly before slowing in the last 10 metres to finish in 9.98 seconds. Coleman moved silently past waiting media in Khalifa International Stadium, leaving Gatlin to talk about his rival's problems.

"I've had contact with him and had a relationship with him, way before he turned pro," Gatlin said. "When people are going through anything in life, you want to reach out to him."

Gatlin, 37, was suspended twice for doping violations. In 2017, he beat Bolt at worlds and was greeted with boos in London.

Reporters asked Gatlin what the event is like without his former rival's star power.

"Just say his name. It's cool," Gatlin said. "You treat him like Voldemort from Harry Potter."

That is how some are treating the 23-year-old Coleman after the three missed drug tests across a year.

Semenya is barred from these championships for failing to take drugs demanded by the IAAF to reduce her natural testosterone level. The women's 800 metres heats started without the woman who won gold at the last two Olympics and three world championships.

But the first of the 30 Russians entered as neutrals did take to the track after passing vetting of their drug-testing histories. They aren't allowed to use their flag or play their anthem.

Shapovalov in semis at Chengdu

Canada's Denis Shapovalov is off to the semifinals of the Chengdu Open.

The No. 8 seed from Richmond Hill, Ont., beat Egor Gerasimov of Belarus 6-4, 3-6, 6-3 in a quarterfinal on Friday at the ATP Tour 250 event.

It marks Shapovalov's third semifinal appearance of the year. The world No. 34 can reach his first final of 2019 with a win over 63rd-ranked Pablo Carreno Busta of Spain on Saturday.

"It feels great. I feel like I'm in good form, kind of getting over that jet leg now," Shapovalov said.

Shapovalov won 85 per cent of points on first serve and notched nine aces against the 98th-ranked Gerasimov.

"It was tough today," Shapovalov said. "Egor's a very good player, a very good up-and-coming guy. It was difficult, it's tough to read his serve and he's pretty flashy. Tough match, so I'm really happy to get the win and be in another semis."

Shapovalov, 20, has won eight of his past 10 matches after enduring a rocky stretch following a run to the Miami Open semis in March.

Shapovalov will move up to at least 32nd in the world rankings next week. He could move as high as 25th if he wins the tournament.

WATER MAIN FLUSHING & FIRE HYDRANT INSPECTIONS

Environmental Utilities performs regular, routine maintenance to uphold the water quality and system infrastructure by annually flushing water mains and inspecting fire hydrants.

During these operations, there may be some discoloration in the water which is not harmful to consume and will disappear when flushing is complete. Please note that discoloured water should not be used for laundry and that fluctuating water pressure may also be noticed.

Should discoloration persist beyond three hours, turn on your cold water tap or an outside sprinkler and let the water run for several minutes until the water runs clear.
