

Auger-Aliassime earns semifinal berth at Rotterdam

ROTTERDAM, Netherlands
Canada's Felix Auger-Aliassime is heading to the semifinals at the ABN AMRO World Tennis Tournament in Rotterdam.

The 19-year-old from Montreal beat Slovenia's Aljaz Bedene 6-4, 7-6 (6) in quarterfinal play at the ATP Tour 500 indoor hardcourt event on Friday.

It marks the second semifinal

appearance of the year for Auger-Aliassime, who is ranked 21st in the world.

He'll face No. 30 Pablo Carreno Busta after the Spaniard saved two match points to beat Italy's Jannik Sinner by a score of 7-5, 3-6, 7-6 (6).

Against the 52nd-ranked Bedene, Auger-Aliassime had 10 aces and just one double

fault. He won 80 per cent of points when he got his first serve in.

Auger-Aliassime saved one set point in the tiebreak.

The Canadian let a 3-0 lead slip away in the second set before rebounding to win the tiebreak.

"In the second set, I was a little bit frustrated with myself how he came back and I gave

away too many free points," Auger-Aliassime said.

"I felt like he was playing better and better, and I had to accept the challenge. The tiebreak could have gone so many ways, but I am happy with the way I fought."

Auger-Aliassime is searching for his first career ATP Tour title.

He made it to three finals last year, which was his first full season on tour.

CART COLLECTION TIPS

- Carts must be out by 7 a.m. on your collection day.
- Waste carts are collected separately with collection times that vary throughout the day.
- Make sure carts are accessible with 3ft (1m) clearance on all sides.
- Ensure cart lids are closed to avoid litter or collection problems.
- Avoid placing carts on or behind snowbanks.
- Contaminated blue recycling carts will not be collected.

To prevent theft or damage to your cart; remove carts off roadways, sidewalks, back lanes etc. and return to private property within 24 hours of collection.

PROTECT WATER LINES FROM FREEZING

The following actions should be considered to protect your water lines:

- Repair broken windows and ensure windows/vents are closed during the winter.
- Insulate water pipes in unheated areas, including crawl spaces.
- For sinks located against a non-insulated outside wall:
 - Open the vanity door to allow warm air to reach the water pipes.
 - A light bulb placed near the water pipe may generate enough heat to keep the water flowing.
 - Heat tape wrapped around the pipe may keep the pipe from freezing.
- Residents of mobile homes should check the condition of the heat tape on their water service and water meter.
- Protect unheated indoor water meter with an insulated box and water pipes should be wrapped in insulation using heat tape.

- Outside water taps and underground sprinkler systems should have the water supply shut off inside the house at the isolation valve for the tap.
- Sprinkler lines and taps should be drained/blown out.
- A thin stream of water (as thick as a pen) running continuously from at least one tap will help prevent a frozen water service.
- If you plan to be away from home over the winter period, close the main water isolation valve located next to the water meter in your home. You should leave the heat on in your home and have someone check inside your home daily while you're away.

A frozen water service, or a burst water pipe, is an inconvenience and expense that most people would like to avoid. Please take all possible precautions to prevent this happening in your home or business.

IDP Bylaw Approvals

Please be advised that the Councils of Cypress County, the Town of Redcliff and the City of Medicine Hat have each passed first reading and will be holding a JOINT PUBLIC HEARING at the above-noted date, time and location for the following bylaws:

- Town of Redcliff Bylaw #1898/2020 - being the adoption of the Tri-Area Intermunicipal Development Plan (IDP)
- Cypress County Bylaw #2020/03 - being the adoption of the Tri-Area Intermunicipal Development Plan (IDP)
- City of Medicine Hat Bylaw #4605 - being the adoption of the Tri-Area Intermunicipal Development Plan (IDP)

The proposed IDP is a statutory plan jointly developed by the Councils of the three municipalities. The purpose of the IDP is to provide for land use planning cooperation between the municipalities. The IDP addresses a number of key planning issues on lands in proximity to municipal boundaries such as identifying areas that are appropriate for specific types of development and land uses, examining

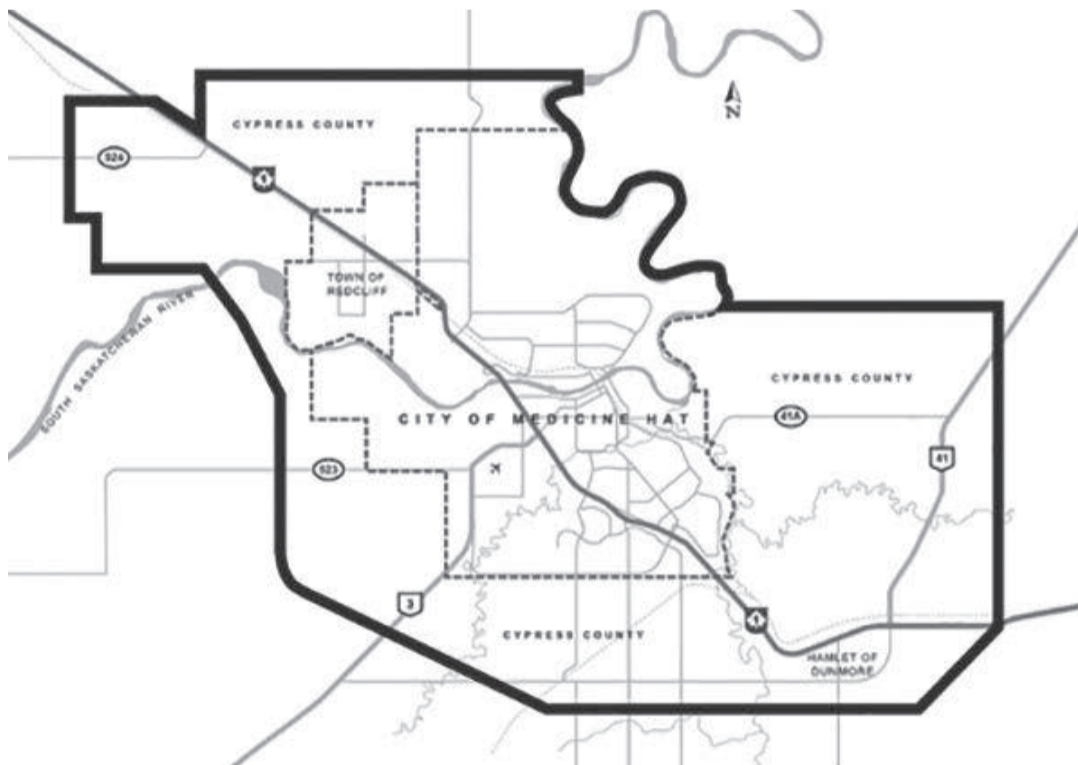
future growth potential, protecting the natural environment, and creating policies to deal with subdivision and development. The IDP boundary is shown in the attached map. The IDP also provides policy direction that requires consistency with, and changes to the Town, County and City Municipal Development Plans.

Public Hearing Submissions

Each Council in session will consider any oral or written submission from interested persons or groups wishing to speak for or against the proposed bylaws noted above. Unless otherwise allowed by the Chair, oral submissions will be limited to 5 minutes.
