Teenager leads LPGA event

COQUITLAM, B.C. Lydia Ko and Chella Choi share the clubhouse lead at the Canadian Women's Open. Ko, a 15-year-old phenom who is still an amateur, and Choi sit at 8-under 136 after today's second round at the Vancouver Golf Club. Ko, who was born in South Korea but calls New Zealand home, shot her second straight 4-under 68. She

moved up from a share of third place following the first round. Meanwhile, Choi, also a South Korea native, charged up the leaderboard with a sizzling 8-under 64. It was a big improvement from the first round, when she only managed an even-par 72 and found herself in 32nd place. Ko and Choi overtook first-round leader Yani Tseng. The world No. 1 struggled and fell off the pace.

Watney, Garcia lead The Barclays

FARMINGDALE, N.Y. The common phrase this year — "Tiger's back" — took on a new meaning Friday at The Barclays. Woods felt a twinge in his lower back when he awoke and felt pain throughout the second round at Bethpage Black. He managed to overcome a bogey-bogey start and get within range of Nick Watney

and the resurgent Sergio Garcia. Garcia, who won last week for his first PGA Tour win in four years, had a 68. Watney had a 69, giving him a share of the 36-hole lead and a chance to salvage a dismal year. They were at 8-under 134. Woods had a 69 and was three shots out of the lead going into the weekend, where some two dozen players were separated by only five shots.

Career wiped away

USADA wastes no time in expunging Armstrong's results

The champagne toasts on the Champs-Elysees and the two-fingered "V" for victory signs he flashed while pedaling to the finish line. The excruciating mountain climbs and the explosions of power that pushed him past other heaving cyclists on narrow Alpine roads. The legions of fans wearing yellow Livestrong bracelets cheering on the cancer survivor whose grit and determination gave them hope. Faded images are all that remain of the unprecedented cycling career of Lance Armstrong. The U.S. Anti-Doping Agency erased the rest of it on Friday.

It wiped out 14 years of Armstrong's career — including his record seven Tour de France titles — and barred him for life from the sport after concluding he used banned substances. USADA said it expected cycling's governing body to take similar action, but the International Cycling Union was measured in its response, saying it first wanted a full explanation of why Armstrong should relinquish Tour titles he won from 1999 through 2005. The Amaury Sport Organization, which runs the world's most prestigious cycling race, said it would not comment until hearing from

Landis remains in hot water

SAN DIEGO Cyclist Floyd Landis agreed Friday to repay donors nearly a half-million dollars that he raised to challenge doping allegations in an agreement with federal prosecutors that may spare him criminal charges of lying to supporters about his drug use. If Landis fails to repay them in three years, federal prosecutors may pursue a single count of wire fraud, exposing him to up to 20 years in prison if convicted. Phillip Halpern, an assistant U.S. attorney, persuaded a judge to release Landis without bail following the federal grand jury investigation. "I think it's safe to say Mr. Landis has known about

these proceedings for months, if not over a year. Mr. Landis has always been extremely co-operative," Halpern told U.S. Magistrate Judge Jan Alder. As part of his "deferred prosecution" agreement, Landis admitted defrauding 1,765 donors out of \$478,354 — an amount he will fully repay. His attorney, Leo Cunningham, pleaded not guilty on his client's behalf and prosecutors immediately agreed not to pursue charges while Landis reimburses supporters. Landis, 36, apologized to his donors as he left the federal building. He won the Tour de France in 2006 but was stripped of the title after an arbitration panel upheld the results of a positive test for synthetic testosterone.

the UCI and USADA. The U.S. agency contends the cycling body is bound by the World Anti-Doping Code to strip Armstrong of one of the most incredible achievements in sports. Armstrong, who retired a year ago and turns 41 next month, said Thursday he would no longer challenge USADA and declined to exercise his last option by entering arbitration. He denied again that he ever took banned substances in his career, calling USADA's investigation a "witch hunt" without any physical evidence. He is now officially a drug

cheat in the eyes of his nation's doping agency. USADA chief executive Travis Tygart described the investigation as a battle against a "win-at-all-cost culture," adding that the UCI was "bound to recognize our decision and impose it." "They have no choice but to strip the titles under the code," he said. Armstrong on Friday sent a tweet that he's still planning to ride in a mountain bike race in Aspen, Colo., on Saturday and follow it up with running a marathon on Sunday, but he did not comment directly on the sanctions.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE LAND USE BYLAW #3181 1156 -27TH STREET S.E.

TAKE NOTICE that City Council gave First Reading on Monday August 20th, 2012 to Bylaw #4134, a Bylaw of the City of Medicine Hat to amend Bylaw #3181, the Land Use Bylaw.

The land that is the subject of proposed Bylaw #4134, legally described as Block 1, Plan 8110363 (the "subject land") is presently designated as P-S - Public Services District under the Land Use Bylaw.

And Whereas an application has been made to re-designate the subject land as C2 Neighbourhood Commercial District to enable a wider range of allowable uses on the site.

A Public Hearing in general accordance with the Municipal Government Act and the City's Procedure Bylaw, and consideration of the Second and Third Readings of proposed Bylaw 4134 will be held in Council Chambers at 580 First Street S.E. in Medicine Hat, Alberta on Monday, September 17th, 2012, beginning at approximately 6:30 p.m.

A copy of proposed Bylaw 4134 and related documents may be inspected during normal office hours (8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.) at the City Clerk Department, Second Floor, City Hall, 580 First Street S.E., Medicine Hat, Alberta, or accessed on the City's website at www.medicinehat.ca (Hover your mouse over the "City Government" heading, click on "Bylaws", click again on the hypertext link "Bylaws", then scroll to the heading "Proposed Bylaws" and choose Bylaw 4134)

Any person who claims to be affected by the proposed rezoning of the subject land may make representation to City Council at the Public Hearing. Oral submissions are limited to five minutes.

Anyone wishing to have a written submission concerning this proposed bylaw placed before the City Council must submit it to the City Clerk Department by 12:00 o'clock noon, Wednesday, September 12th, 2012.
