

Isner downs Djokovic in stunner

Novak Djokovic dumped another pressure-packed shot into the net and stood in place for a moment, stunned by another upset in Cincinnati. It's the only place where he can't win.

Top-ranked American John Isner ended Djokovic's attempt to make ATP history Friday, beating the No. 1 player 7-6 (5), 3-6, 7-5 in the quarter-finals at the Western & Southern Open.

Djokovic has never won in Cincinnati, the only Masters event that has eluded him during his career. He has lost in the finals four times, including last year to Roger Federer. All he needs to do is hoist the winner's trophy one time in Cincinnati to become the first player to win all nine Masters events.

Wait until next year. Again.

"It's disappointing that I played this way," Djokovic said. "For me, it's very disappointing."

Isner reached the semifinals in Cincinnati for the first time, knocking off a No. 1 for only the second time in his career. His other No. 1 upset? He beat Djokovic at Indians Wells in the semifinals last year.

"A fantastic win for me," Isner said. "Certainly one of my greatest memories as a tennis player."

He'll play seventh-seeded Juan Martin del Potro, who advanced Friday by beating qualifier Dmitry Tursunov 6-4, 3-6, 6-1. Del Potro is in the semifinals for the second straight year.

Soon after Djokovic got knocked out, No. 2 Andy Murray was gone, too. He failed to convert a break point while losing 6-3, 6-4 to Tomas Berdych, who also beat him in the quarter-finals at Madrid.

They were relegated to the adjoining grandstand court. Both players strug-

gled with the loud music, announcements and cheering from centre court.

"I think this was my best moment of the game to handle this because I was struggling with the noise around the court and the distraction," Berdych said. "You know, I handled it pretty well today."

Murray? Not so much. At least it got the Wimbledon champion prepared for Flushing Meadows.

"I think in some ways it's good preparation for the U.S. Open because normally the U.S. Open is fairly loud," Murray said. "You know, a lot of movement and music, and they have the big screen and stuff. So, yeah, you get used to that playing here."

In the women's draw, top-seeded Serena Williams needed only 64 minutes to beat Simona Halep 6-0, 6-4. She'll play Li Na, who advanced to the semifinals automatically when No. 4 Agnieszka Radwanska withdrew to attend her grandfather's funeral.

NOTICE OF FIRST READING DEBENTURE BORROWING UTILITY BYLAWS

TAKE NOTICE that the municipal council of the City of Medicine Hat gave first reading on Tuesday, August 6, 2013 to Utility Borrowing Bylaws #4178, 4179, 4180, 4181, 4182, 4183, 4184, 4185, and 4186. In order to complete the projects (the Project) listed below, the City has elected to borrow monies from the Alberta Capital Finance Authority (ACFA) or another authorized financial institution by the issuance of debentures, pursuant to Section 258 of the *Municipal Government Act* RSA 2000 Chapter M-26

The above Bylaws come into force on January 1, 2014. The Municipality shall repay the indebtedness of Bylaw #4184 according to the repayment structure in effect, namely semi-annual or annual equal payments of combined principal and interest installments for a period not to exceed ten (10) years calculated at a rate not exceeding the interest rate fixed by the Alberta Capital Finance Authority or another authorized financial institution on the date of the borrowing and not to exceed ten (10%) percent.

The Municipality shall repay the indebtedness of Bylaws #4185 and 4186 according to the repayment structure in effect, namely semi-annual or annual equal payments of combined principal and interest installments for a period not to exceed fifteen (15) years calculated at a rate not exceeding the interest rate fixed by the Alberta Capital Finance Authority or another authorized financial institution on the date of the borrowing and not to exceed ten (10%) percent.

The Municipality shall repay the indebtedness of Bylaws #4178 and 4181 according to the repayment structure in effect, namely semi-annual or annual equal payments of combined principal and interest installments for a period not to exceed twenty (20) years calculated at a rate not exceeding the interest rate fixed by the Alberta Capital Finance Authority or another authorized financial institution on the date of the borrowing and not to exceed ten (10%) percent.

The Municipality shall repay the indebtedness of Bylaws #4179, 4180, 4182 and 4183 according to the repayment structure in effect, namely semi-annual or annual equal payments of combined principal and interest installments for a period not to exceed twenty-five (25) years calculated at a rate not exceeding the interest rate fixed by the Alberta Capital Finance Authority or another authorized financial institution on the date of the borrowing and not to exceed ten (10%) percent.

AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that, unless a sufficient petition demanding a poll of the electors is received within 15 days following the date of the last publication of this Notice, the Council may pass the said borrowing bylaws as described in the *Municipal Government Act*, Sections 219 to 226.

AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that copies of the aforesaid proposed Bylaws may be inspected by the public during normal office hours (8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.) at the City Clerk Department, Second Floor, City Hall, Medicine Hat, Alberta, or accessed on the City's website at www.medicinehat.ca.

OFF - SITE LEVY BYLAW #4157 (PROVIDING FOR THE IMPOSITION AND PAYMENT OF OFF-SITE LEVIES)

TAKE NOTICE that City Council gave First Reading on Tuesday August 6th, 2013 to Bylaw #4157, a Bylaw of the City of Medicine Hat to provide for the imposition and payment of off-site levies in respect of lands that are to be developed or subdivided and to authorize agreements to be entered into in respect of the payment of the levies.

WHEREAS certain lands within the corporate boundaries of the City are proposed for subdivision or residential, commercial or industrial developments.

AND WHEREAS Council for the City of Medicine Hat requires an expenditure for capital costs for:
• Water supply, transmission, treatment and storage facilities;
• Sanitary sewage treatment, movement and disposal facilities;
• Storm sewer drainage facilities;
• Roads required for or impacted by subdivision or development;
• Land required for or in connection with any facilities, as mentioned above, because of population growth now occurring in the City.

AND WHEREAS the City has had a series of meetings and discussions with representatives of the development industry to address and define existing and future infrastructure requirements of the City, to allocate the costs to the beneficiaries of development on an equitable basis related to the degree of benefit.

AND WHEREAS following the consultation with the representatives of the development industry and based upon the principles agreed upon, the City administration has presented a methodology for funding the facilities to Council for consideration and direction.

AND WHEREAS the City presently imposes and collects off-site levies.

AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that a non-statutory Public Hearing in general accordance with Procedure Bylaw #2270 and consideration of Second/Third Readings of the proposed bylaw will be held by the City Council in the City Hall Council Chambers, Main Floor, on Tuesday, September 3rd, 2013, beginning at approximately 6:30 p.m. on the matter.

A copy of proposed Bylaw 4157 and related documents may be inspected during normal office hours (8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.) at the City Clerk Department, Second Floor, City Hall, 580 First Street S.E., Medicine Hat, Alberta, or accessed via the 'Proposed Bylaw' section on the City's website at www.medicinehat.ca

Any person who claims to be affected by the proposed bylaw may make representation to City Council at the non-statutory Public Hearing. Oral submissions are limited to five minutes.

Anyone wishing to have a written submission concerning this proposed bylaw placed before the City Council must submit it to the City Clerk Department by 12:00 o'clock noon, Wednesday, August 28th, 2013.
