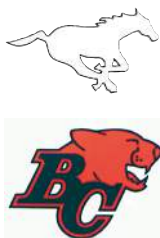


Stamps triumph

The Calgary Stampeders remain unbeaten at home this season after a 35-23 win over the visiting B.C. Lions on Friday.
Calgary improves to 9-3, sit atop the CFL's West Division and is 7-0 at McMahon Stadium.
The Lions fall to 4-7. Jeff Fuller and Tony Harrison had touchdown catches for Calgary. Running back Jon Cornish scored on a 16-yard carry and back-up quarterback Bryant Moniz also

scored on a one-yard plunge. B.C. returner Chris Rainey scored touchdowns on punt and kickoff returns of 103 yards each.

Saskatchewan rookie Demski a bright light in dismal 2015 season

Whether the Saskatchewan Roughriders believe they're playing for next year or just fielding the best team they can this season, Nic Demski is a big part of either scenario.



The rookie receiver feels he fits in with the youth movement, should that be the direction the team takes for the remainder of the season now that a playoff berth seems unattainable.
The Roughriders sport a 1-10 record entering play on Saturday when they

host the Ottawa Redblacks (6-4) at Mosaic Stadium. The playoff picture for Saskatchewan faded a little more after a deflating defeat in Winnipeg one week after the team picked up its first win of the season over the Blue Bombers in the Labour Day Classic.

"It has been frustrating at times, but it's all about learning and getting better," said Demski, the Riders' first-round pick in the 2015 draft (sixth overall). "This is only my rookie season, so I can't expect too much of myself. But when I do get in there I know I have to capitalize on my chances and do what I can to help this team win."

Jones looking forward to rematch with Ti-Cats

He's taking his team into hostile territory and Eskimos head coach Chris Jones can't wait.

The Edmonton Eskimos face the Hamilton Tiger-Cats on Saturday afternoon at Tim Hortons Field, where the defending East Division champions are 11-1 since the facility opened midway through last year. Although the Ti-Cats dropped a 26-23 home decision to Montreal last month to end a 10-game win streak, they rallied for an impressive 42-12 Labour Day win over the Toronto Argonauts in their last game there.

"They're very good at home, they're a very spirited group," Jones told reporters this week. "It's fun to go over there and compete against them ... it's fun to go to those new stadiums where the people are so energetic."

Hamilton (8-3) has certainly enjoyed rabid support at its new facility. Every game there has been a sell-out and the Ti-Cats' home domination is a big reason why they're atop the East Division.

The popular notion has always been for the visitor to score early and often and take the home crowd out of the game. But Jones said a complete effort is the bigger key to Edmonton's potential success at Tim Hortons Field.
