Toronto Blue Jays beat Baltimore Orioles 9-5 to open Grapefruit League season

SARASOTA, Fla. — The Toronto Blue Jays belted seven doubles to batter the Baltimore Orioles 9-5 in their Grapefruit League opener on Friday. Shortstop Jordan Groshans, first baseman Greg Bird, catchers Danny Jansen and Tyler Heineman, centre-fielder Mallex Smith, second baseman Vinny Capra and right-fielder Logan Wartho all doubled for Toronto in the spring training win. Blue Jays starter Jose Berrios surrendered two hits and two earned runs before getting the hook with two out in the first inning.

Toronto managed to chase Orioles starting pitcher Spenser Watkins after 2.2 innings of work, tagging him for six runs on four hits. With the Blue Jays clinging to a 6-5 lead, Heineman connected on a two-RBI double in the top of the ninth to seal the victory. Orioles shortstop Richie Martin was 1-for-2 with three RBI in the loss. Ten different batters combined on 10 hits for the Blue Jays, while the Orioles mustered only seven hits off Toronto pitching. The Blue Jays host the Philadelphia Phillies on Saturday in Dunedin, Fla.

Bayern says Alphonso Davies several weeks away from returning to action

MUNICH — Bayern Munich manager Julian Nagelsmann says Canadian soccer star Alphonso Davies is still several weeks away from returning to action. That prognosis would rule him out of Canada's final three World Cup qualifying matches. The 21-year-old from Edmonton has been sidelined since early January due to symptoms of myocarditis, a mild heart condition, following a bout of COVID. But he has made progress recently with video this week showing the speedy fullback doing individual workouts at Bayern's training centre. "We have had a good checkup today as well but it's just slowly getting back into it," Nagelsmann said Friday. "He probably will be back in about three to four weeks, at least that is still our goal. So he will be playing that Champions League game hopefully against Villarreal if everything works as usual."

Bayern is scheduled to meet Spain's Villarreal in the two-legged Champions League quarterfinal on April 6 and 12.



Nagelsmann was speaking ahead of Bayern's Bundesliga match against visiting FC Union Berlin on Saturday. Canada, which tops the eight-team final round robin in CONCACAF at 7-0-4, is on the verge of qualifying for Qatar 2022. John Herdman's team plays at Costa Rica on March 24 before hosting Jamaica on March 27 in Toronto and finishing off March 30 in Panama. The illness has meant Davies has not played for Canada since a pair of World Cup qualifying wins in November in Edmonton. Bayern said Jan. 5 that Davies had joined a lengthy list of players who had tested positive for COVID, adding the speedy fullback was well and self-isolating at home.

PROTECT WATER LINES FROM FREEZING

- The following actions should be considered to protect your water lines:
- Repair broken windows and ensure windows/vents are closed during the winter.
 - Insulate water pipes in unheated areas, including crawl spaces.
 - For sinks located against a non-insulated outside wall:
 - Open the vanity door to allow warm air to reach the water pipes.
 - A light bulb placed near the water pipe may generate enough heat to keep the water flowing.
 - Heat tape wrapped around the pipe may keep the pipe from freezing.
 - Residents of mobile homes should check the condition of the heat tape on their water service and water meter.
 - Protect unheated indoor water meter with an insulated box and water pipes should be wrapped in insulation using heat tape.
