

# Auger-Aliassime continues scorching season-ending run with win over Tiafoe in Paris

Felix Auger-Aliassime's brilliant late-season surge continued Friday with a 6-1, 6-4 win over Frances Tiafoe in the quarterfinals of the Paris Masters.

The 22-year-old from Montreal clinched his 16th straight victory on his sixth match point, hammering a forehand past the American. Auger-Aliassime entered Paris on the heels of three straight

tournament wins.

The Canadian has earned a spot in the ATP Finals starting Nov. 13 in Turin, Italy. It's the first time Auger-Aliassime has qualified for the elite season-ending tournament.

"I feel better and better," Auger-Aliassime said in a post-match interview with the ATP. "I heard Novak (Djokovic) saying yesterday that you can always improve and he's won how many Grand Slams, so I

can definitely improve a lot more in future.

"Of course right now I'm playing well and feeling good, but I see things that I can still do better and still improve on to be able to top the game."

Down 3-5 in the second set, Tiafoe saved five match points to hold serve. Auger-Aliassime then fell behind love-15 and 15-30 before reeling off three straight points for the victory. Auger-Aliassime improved

his record against Tiafoe to 3-0.

"Of course, I had match points at 5-3 ... (He) tried everything and tried many different ways to stay in the match," Auger-Aliassime said. "He did for one more game, but I'm happy that I was able to be clutch in those moments."

"Serving for the match (I) stayed cool and played great points when I needed to."

The eighth seed will next face Denmark's Holger Rune in

a rematch of last week's final at the Swiss Indoors tournament. Auger-Aliassime won the match 6-3, 7-5.

Rune advanced past Spain's Carlos Alcaraz when the world No. 1 retired with an injury. Rune was leading 6-3, 6-6 at the time.

Auger-Aliassime has won four titles on the ATP Tour, all coming this year. He is seeking his first Masters-level victory in Paris.

#### CART COLLECTION TIPS

- Carts must be out by 7 a.m. on your collection day.
- Waste carts are collected separately with collection times that vary throughout the day.
- Make sure carts are accessible with 3ft (1m) clearance on all sides.
- Ensure cart lids are closed to avoid litter or collection problems.
- Contaminated blue recycling carts as well as yard waste material in plastic bags will not be collected.

To prevent theft or damage to your carts, remove carts off roadways, sidewalks, back lanes etc. and return to private property within 24 hours of collection.

### NEW RIGHT-TURN ONLY LANE CONFIGURATION ON DUNMORE ROAD SE AT SPENCER STREET SE IN FORCE NOVEMBER 9, 2022

On Wednesday, November 9, 2022 a new lane configuration to improve traffic flow at the intersection of Dunmore Road SE and Spencer Street SE will be in effect.

The right northbound lane on Dunmore Road SE will change from a combined straight-through/right-turn lane to a dedicated right-turn only lane onto Spencer Street SE.

The yield sign for westbound traffic on Spencer Street SE turning northbound onto Kingsway Avenue SE will also be removed as part of the improvement.

Watch for new signs along the roadway and on the overhead traffic signal arms.

Drivers are reminded that when facing a traffic control signal displaying a red light, they must bring their vehicle to a complete stop before proceeding through the right turn if the turn can be made safely after yielding to other traffic.

### GAS, ELECTRIC, WIND ENERGY RATES SET FOR NOVEMBER

**Medicine Hat - The City of Medicine Hat has set its November energy commodity rates.**

#### Natural Gas

The November natural gas commodity rate of \$5.5070 per gigajoule (GJ), up from the previous month of \$5.1140 per GJ, for all customers is based on the average of the monthly gas charges set by Alberta gas distribution (pipes) owners.

The City of Medicine Hat calculates the Monthly Reference Price based on the average of the rates approved by the Alberta Utilities Commission.

#### Electricity

The November electricity rate of \$0.17734 per kilowatt hour, down from the previous month of \$0.18723 per kilowatt hour, for Residential, Farm, Small and Medium Commercial, Unmetered Services and Rental Lighting, is based on the average of the rates for owners whose regulated rate tariffs are approved by the Alberta Utilities Commission under section 103(2) of the Electric Utilities Act for that calendar month as posted by the Alberta Utilities Commission on its internet page under *Regulated Rate Option Regulation*.

The City of Medicine Hat calculates the Monthly Reference Price based on the average of the rates using the four Regulated Rate Option providers approved by the Alberta Utilities Commission under section 103(2) of the Electric Utilities Act.

The November default electricity rate for Large Commercial, Industrial and Street Lighting customers is based on the monthly average Alberta Power Pool price as established and published by the Alberta Electric System Operator (AESO) plus \$0.02 per kilowatt hour. The rate for October was \$0.16234 per kilowatt hour.

#### Fixed Rate Option

The City of Medicine Hat also offers a fixed electric commodity price for Residential, Farm, Small and Medium Commercial customers. The fixed rate for 2022 is \$0.0800 per kilowatt hour.

The Gas Utility offers a fixed natural gas commodity price for all rate class customers. The fixed rate for 2022 is \$4.35 per GJ.

#### Going Green Charge

Customers also have a "Going Green" surcharge on their bill. This surcharge is for renewable energy purchased for residential, farm, small and medium commercial customers.

The Going Green surcharge is calculated monthly to recover costs incurred to purchase renewable energy.

The Going Green surcharge for November is \$0.0005 per kilowatt hour.
