BYLAW NO: 1982

CONSOLIDATION OF A BYLAW OF THE CITY OF MEDICINE HAT to regulate and control weeds.

Amended by: Bylaw 2758 July 6, 1992 WHEREAS Section 7 (1) of the <u>Weed Control Act</u> R.S.A. 1980 c. W-6 as amended provides that:

7 (1) A local authority may make bylaws designating plants within the municipality as restricted, noxious or nuisance weeds.

Amended by: Bylaw 2758 July 6, 1992 AND WHEREAS Section 8 (2) of the <u>Weed Control Act</u> R.S.A. 1980 c. W-6 as amended provides that:

8 (2) A local authority may, with respect to a highway that is subject to the direction, management, and control of the local authority, by bylaw provide that the occupant or owner of land shall, for the purpose of this Act, be considered to be the occupant of that portion of the highway that lies between the boundary of his land and the Centre line of the highway.

NOW THEREFORE THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF MEDICINE HAT IN COUNCIL ASSEMBLED ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. This bylaw may be cited as "The Weed Control Bylaw".
- 2. That attached hereto and forming part of this bylaw is Schedule "A" which contains a list of plants within the municipality which are designated as restricted, noxious or nuisance weeds.

- 3. (1) The occupant or owner of any land within the boundaries of the City of Medicine Hat, shall for the purpose of the Weed Control Act R.S.A. 1980 c. W-6 as amended, be considered to be the occupant of that portion of any highway that lies between the boundary of his land and the centre line of the highway.
 - (2) The term "highway" in Subsection (1) includes any thoroughfare, street, road, trail, avenue, parkway, driveway, viaduct, lane, alley, square, bridge, causeway, trestleway or other place, whether publicly or privately owned, any part of which the public is ordinarily entitled or permitted to use the passage or parking of vehicles, and
 - (i) includes:
 - (A) a sidewalk (including a boulevard portion thereof),
 - (B) where a ditch lies adjacent to and parallel with the roadway, the ditch, and
 - (C) where a highway right of way is contained between fences or between a fence and one side of the roadway, all the land between the fences, or all the land between the fence and the edge of the roadway, as the case may be.

but:

- (ii) does not include a place declared by the Lieutenant Governor in Council not to be a highway.
- 4. Bylaw No. 3155 and amendments thereto is hereby repealed.

This bylaw shall take effect upon being approved by the Minister of Agriculture or by a person to whom the Minister of Agriculture has, in writing, delegated the power of approval, pursuant to the provisions of Sections 2 and 9 of the Weed Control Act R.S.A. 1980 c. W-6 as amended.
