Jim's Café

This is a one story building on the north side of the 600 block, 2nd St. S.E. On Jul. 10, 1912, building permit #337, was issued to owner/architect JK Drinnan, with the note that it was a "special permit by council". Five weeks later J.D. Cameron was recruiting staff for his brand new eating establishment. On Aug 14, 1912 he places a want ad in the Medicine Hat News which reads: "Wanted: First class lady or gent cook. Apply at Jim's Café, Main Street. Old Star Theatre stand." The café was built on the site previously occupied by the Star Theatre, photo of which is listed below, second building west from the Turpin block.
