H.1 An early house on the fashionable street along the river front leading into the City centre. It was constructed for William Crawford, long time resident. He was a prominent early citizen, retire CPR Engineer, president of the Medicine Hat News Company, served on the Hospital Board and as an elder in the St. John's Presbyterian Church.

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Site Name: CRAWFORD HOUSE

Description of Historic Place:

The building is a two storey brick structure designed in the Queen Anne style. It has an asymmetric floor plan, hipped roof with gable dormers, wrap-around verandah, and projecting square bay. It is located on a major roadway along the river front at a prominent intersection in the fashionable residential district.

Heritage Value of Historic Place:

The heritage value of the Crawford House lies in its status as an early residence built on the Esplanade, a riverfront street of fine homes leading into the centre of Medicine Hat. The house was built in 1901 for William Crawford, who among his other interests was president of the Medicine Hat News Company, secretary-treasurer of the Medicine Hat Steam Laundry Company, and a member of the local hospital board.

Character Defining Elements:

The character defining elements include:

- brick structure
- asymmetric floor plan
- hipped roof with gable dormers and massive brick chimney wrap-around verandah with elaborate ornamental wood detailing
- two storey projecting square bay window set at an angle to the main building
