A.1 The design is influenced by the Romanesque Revival style, and features; constructed with fieldstone foundations/sandstone plinth/brick walls, hipped and gable roof line with ventilation cupola, Romanesque triple windows in gable end walls, symmetrical window pattern, elaborate entablature, and sandstone string courses.

Description of Historic Place:The building is a 2 1/2 storey, load bearing brick and sandstone structure. The design is a simplified Romanesque Revival style with hipped and gable roof lines, cupola, triple Romanesque windows in the gables, elaborate entablature, and symmetrical window patterns. It is located in a residential area.

Heritage Value of Historic Place:
The heritage value of the Montreal Street School lies in its status as the oldest existing school building in Medicine Hat, and as a rare example of an historic school that retains its original function. Generations of children in the City's Flats community attended Montreal Street School between 1904 and 1996. This public school building later became home of St. Louis School, a Roman Catholic institution.

Character Defining Elements:

The character defining elements include:

- hipped and gable roof profile
- ventilation cupola
- triple Romanesque windows and gable ends symmetrical placement of windows brick and sandstone construction
