<p><b>Description of Historic Place:</b></p> <p>The building is a three storey, load bearing brick structure. It is designed in the Edwardian Commercial style and features; engaged brick pilasters, symmetrically placed upper level windows, and pressed metal entablature. It is located on a prominent intersection in the centre of the downtown core.</p>
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<p><b>Heritage Value of Historic Place:</b></p> <p>The building is significant because it was developed by a prominent Albertan, William Roper Hull. Occupying a very prominent corner location in the centre of the downtown core with an Eatons store as a long time owner, it was a focal point in the central shopping district.</p>
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<p><b>Character Defining Elements:</b></p> <p>The character defining elements include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- load bearing brick structure</li><li>- engaged brick pilasters</li><li>- symmetrical window pattern on upper floors</li><li>- pressed metal entablature</li><li>- pattern of ground floor display windows</li></ul>
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
