



Through the dynamic interplay of our economic, geographic, legislative, and demographic conditions, Medicine Hat provides several unique advantages and opportunities not found elsewhere in Alberta, including:

- Reliable and affordable access to electricity.
- The capacity to support land, energy, and/or labor-intensive industries.
- Expedient, straightforward, and stress-free interactions with the local government.
- Access to raw materials, markets, and logistics through multiple modes of transportation.

Our overall economic environment reflects our status as one of Western Canada's lowest-cost business centres. In fact, Medicine Hat consistently ranks within the top 5-10 among all Canadian municipalities on both measures of affordability and comfort³.



What's more, unlike many lower-cost population centres, we aren't isolated or remote. Medicine Hat's strategic location offers access to several major North American markets within a single day of travel via highway, railway, and runways. But most importantly, our cost advantages occur without sacrificing in areas such as quality of life or opportunities for education, investment, or leisure.

Medicine Hat Economic Development (MHED) conducts and distributes a broad range of research initiatives to provide localized data and insights for our business community. These efforts help forecast growth while fostering strong working relationships with local businesses.

Medicine Hat offers a unique, all-in-one approach through the vertical integration of municipal services for local businesses. This centralized structure places taxation, land, planning, environmental services, economic development, and city-owned utilities under a single umbrella - streamlining processes and improving business outcomes.

ENVIRONMENT & SUPPORT SERVICES

Medicine Hat boasts a diverse and growing range of successful industries and businesses. This success is driven by the coordinated efforts of municipal departments working collaboratively toward a shared vision for economic growth.

Our Economic Development department, alongside our industry and community partners, delivers essential business supports – providing infrastructure, data, funding access, and enabling legislation that help businesses not only establish themselves, but thrive.

Beyond data, funding, and legislative support, we are committed to fostering a healthy, diverse, and high-quality workforce. Medicine Hat benefits from a balanced mix of skilled and entry-level labour, above-average educational attainment, and a workforce that combines experience with emerging talent. With a median age of 42 and more than 23,000 residents between the ages of 20 and 49, the city offers employers both stability and long-term workforce sustainability.⁴



Workforce **DEVELOPMENT** AND EDUCATION

From high school to post-secondary and skilled trades

Strategic local investments in training programs and facilities ensure that Medicine Hat is well positioned to support a workforce capable of meeting the needs of a wide range of industries.

Medicine Hat College (MHC) plays a central role in the region's research and workforce development pipelines. With a growing **campus of nearly 2,500 students, MHC offers more than 40 certificate, diploma, degree, trades, and university studies programs**, supported by a dynamic research and innovation centre known as C4i.



MHC fully embraces its mandate to respond to regional workforce needs. Programming spans courses, certificates, diplomas, apprenticeship trades, and degrees, often delivered in partnership with other institutions. **When required training programs are not currently available through MHC or regional partners, the college works directly with employers** to co-create customized courses aligned with specific workforce requirements.

Beyond post-secondary education, Medicine Hat also supports a **strong ecosystem of skilled trade apprenticeship programs**. Approximately 1,000 new apprentices register in the city each year, reinforcing the strength of the local trades workforce.

Overall, 48.5% of residents 15 and older have obtained a post-secondary degree, diploma, or certificate of some kind. Of those, 10.6% are in a skilled trade, 23.6% is college diploma or equivalent, and 14.3% received a bachelor's degree or higher.⁵

From post-secondary institutions, public schools, and skilled trade apprenticeship training programs, Medicine Hat is **building one of Alberta's most comprehensive** labour development pipelines.

INNOVATION & THE ENVIRONMENT



Despite our historic city monicker, *The Gas City*, Medicine Hat recognizes the great importance of **environmental stewardship and sustainable innovation** as we work to reduce our emissions and help lead the transition to a lower-carbon future.

A substantial part of that commitment is supporting the development and commercialization of **renewable energy projects**. Our on-going Energy Innovation Challenge, for example, is a three-year program where applicants pilot innovative energy solutions within city limits as they work to overcome commercialization obstacles.

Medicine Hat also received a permit for a carbon capture and storage exploration study, although the rights for the project were ultimately

purchased by Imperial Oil in 2025. Current projections suggest that the site would offer the ability to sequester up to three million tonnes of CO₂ annually, when operating at full capacity.

The City of Medicine Hat is also exploring utility-scale renewable projects, including the proposed 325MW Saamis Solar Farm, which would add even more capacity to the growing number of renewable energy projects in the area.

Medicine Hat Regional Airport

(YXH) is a strategic transportation and innovation asset serving Southeast Alberta that facilitates significant opportunities in technology-driven industries including aviation and aerospace.

Located just minutes from the Trans-Canada Highway, YXH allows rapid transitions between air, road, and rail transportation networks. Its close proximity to key employers, post-secondary institutions, and major testing ranges creates an ideal environment for research, prototyping, and commercialization.

With serviced land available for both airside and groundside opportunities, the airport is properly positioned to support existing industries while enabling future growth as ongoing land development ensures flexibility for projects of varying scale and complexity.

Key Features and Characteristics:

- Transport Canada certification and Class E airspace designation
- Primary runway of 5,000' x 150' with a secondary runway of 2,850' x 100'
- ~30,000 take-offs and landings annually involving 40 different aircraft models
- Serviced commercial land with airside access available for purchase and development
- ~55-minute flight to YYC; five minutes to CFB Suffield; eight minutes to the Foremost BVLOS Test Range
- Located close to approximately 5,100 km² of Class F restricted airspace ranging from surface to unlimited
- On-site fire hall equipped for aircraft emergencies
- 330 sunny days per year gives it ideal flight and test conditions year-round

Methanex

The Medicine Hat facility is Canada's only commercial-scale methanol manufacturing complex and produces over 600,000 tonnes annually for North American markets.

In 2024, they invested \$100 million to commission a carbon capture engineering and design study. The intention of the project is to utilize a portion of their waste CO₂ to produce an additional 50,000 tonnes of methanol yearly and safely sequestering the rest underground.

Cancarb

A global supplier of Medium Thermal Carbon Black, Cancarb's Medicine Hat facility also generates electricity through its waste heat that's capable of supplying up to 20% of the city's power.

In 2025, Cancarb announced the up-coming installation of 7,000 solar panels to generate electricity for its manufacturing process with the goal of generating up to 3.5 megawatts of renewable electricity per year.

Big Marble Farms

Currently holds the record for Alberta's largest greenhouse with over 72 acres of indoor growing space. Their high-tech operation utilizes advanced lighting and climate control measures to ensure year-round efficiency.

The company recently received \$2.2 million from Alberta's SEMI program to install 5,000 grow lights and reduce the energy and emissions produced by their facility, which saw major expansions in 2012, 2016, and 2020.

Bevo Farms Ltd.

A wholly owned subsidiary of Bevo AgTech, this 39-acre facility supports North America's horticultural supply chain by growing flowers and seedlings for other vegetable growers.

Construction of their Medicine Hat facility began in 2018 at an estimated cost of \$250 million, and was completed in early 2024.

QinetiQ

Their local facility focuses on the development of advanced target systems, including their Rattler supersonic target vehicle for military testing.

In 2019, QinetiQ received a \$51 million contract with the Canadian Armed Forces to manufacture unmanned aircraft systems (UAS) at their Medicine Hat facility. QinetiQ recently earned recognition as a finalist for the ASTech Awards in 2025.

UVAD Technologies

Specializes in the development and commercialization of electric fixed-wing uncrewed aerial vehicles (UAVs) and geophysical surveying devices, as well as collaborating with Raytheon on projects like the Falcon unmanned target vehicle.

In late 2024, the company received \$2.6 million in federal funding through PrairiesCan to aid with the development and commercialization of their UAVs on a global scale.
